We build Hope, Strength, Joy and encourage our students along with their families to *Understand, Accept and Celebrate Being Different*.

Our approach includes early Intervention, therapy, educational services, psychological and vocational courses. We have 3:1 student teacher ratio.

The medical team of multidisciplinary professionals consists of Paediatrician, Occupational Therapists, Speech Therapists, Psychologist, Special Educators and vocational trainers who are involved in quality implementation of project activities.

Yoga, Drama Therapy, Music Therapy and Art Therapy form part of the curriculum to train these children and young adults.





Soap making activity by our vocational unit students:

Students learning soap making under the guidance of Special educator Ms. Arti Srivastava. Beautiful designs are created by them. These soaps are hand made by our young adults with special needs. Different kinds of soaps made here are:

- 1. Glycerin Soaps
- 2. Opaque Soaps
- 3. Herbal Soaps
- 4. Shea butter soaps

The students learn to make more accurate estimates while measuring out ingredients. It is a life skill activity which helps them in calculation, enhancing concentration, showing patience till the final outcome, creating designs etc.






#### AADHAR CARD CAMP AT UDAI

#### Life skill activities during summer:

#### Pickle Making:



Pickle making is an ancient tradition in India which has been loved and followed by or mothers and grand-mothers.

We all have grown up eating delicious, crunchy, and tangy pickles made by our grandmothers and mothers. No meal is complete without them.

As part of learning life skill activity, the students of our vocational unit were trained to make Mango pickle by our experienced trainer. This activity will help our little master chefs learn decision making skills, about choices, their consequences and then look at different situations and discuss the choices to be made. Making Posters, worksheets, and stickers complete the lesson plan.





#### Learning culinary skills:



Every child is gifted, they just unwrap their packages at different times, in different ways. Learning more in-depth daily living skills & chores, such as cooking establishes a responsibility for routines and organizational skills but also sets a foundation for self-sufficiency.

Ms. Arti Srivastava our Special Education Coordinator teach Life skills, Vocational & Social skills to students as per the individualized Educational plan/program developed on basis of requirement and capability of each student. She along with team of special educators create specialized curriculum to follow.

#### Capacity Building workshop for staff of Cheshire Home—Delhi

A workshop was conducted on 31st August, 2019 as part of capacity building of teachers at Cheshire Home.

Dr. Archana Sharma conducted one to one basis Psychological assessment of the children's learning ability at the centre. She shared the specific learning strategies and types of support required by students.

Ms. Tanu Rajput Founder of UDAI and Ms. Deepa Sharma—Head of the OT department had conducted training to the teachers on classroom arrangement and curriculum development.

A participant-centered approach was used during the session because the target staff were in a better position to identify existing weaknesses, strengths and need for change. The facilitators familiarized themselves with the teachers with few Ice breaking activities.

The major areas of classroom management discussed by the resource person were:

- Importance of team work
- Multi dimensional assessment techniques for different categories of students
- Teaching methodologies
- Challenges faced by the teachers working with children with special needs.



- 1. Basic understanding of brain development
- 2. Understand the importance of sensory processing in child development.
- 3. Understanding what sensory systems are.
- 4. Identify possible red-flags for sensory processing challenges and when to ask for an evaluation by a professional.
- 5. Identify activities that engage each sensory system.
